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REVOLUTIONARY WAR DECLARATIONS

(Ed. note: In reading Minutes Docket P & Q 1820-1825 book I have found two Revolutionary War Daclarations - copied in full .)

p 41, Jesse Gattlin

Court of Pleas and Quarterly Session  
February Term, A. D. 1821

State of North Carolina  
Randolph County

On the 8th day of February eighteen hundred and twenty one personally appeared in open court being a court of record for the county and State aforesaid Jesse Gattlin ages seventy two years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration on order to obtain the provisions made by the Act of Congress of the Eighteenth of the Month Eighteen Hundred and Eighteen. In the first of May, eighteen hundred and twenty, that the said Jesse Gattlin entered for the term of six months on the ---- in the state of North Carolina in the Company command- ed by Captain Murphey in the Regement commanded by Colonel Howe in the line of the State of North Carolina on the Continental Establishment that he continue to serve in the same corps until the ---- of March ----- when he was discharged from the (?) Same service in (?)Edinton in the state of North Carolina = that he enlisted for the term of eighteen months on the ----- day of ----- 1780 or 1781. He can't recollect which in the State of North Carolina in the Company commanded by Captain William Lytle in the Regiment commaxded by Archibald Lytle under the command of General Nathanel Green in the line of the state of North Carolina on the Continental Es- tablishment that he continued to serve in the said corps until the thirty first day of August in the year seventeen and eighty two, When he was dic- charged from the said service in Hillsborough state of North Carolina. That hewwas in the Battle of Guilford as a militia man and served with the army under General Green in South Carolina and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service except what is herein set firth.

And in pressuance of the act of the first of May Eighteen Hundred and twenty, I do solemnly swear that I was a citizen of the United States on the Eighteenth of March Eighteen hundred and eighteen and I have not since that time, by gift, sale, of in any other manner disposed of my property so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled, "Act to provide for Certain persons engaged in the land and Naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary War, passed the eighteenth day of March eighteen hundred and eighteen that I have not nor has any person in Trust for me and property or certain contracts or any debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule here to annexed any by me subscribed as follows:

One bed and furniture one fine chist andTaller.

Three pewter basons one desk one churn two selling chairs three knives and five forks on flax wheel one cotton wheel one pair cotton cards two old barrels one cut reel two bottles one pot one oven and (?) seal one small horse 12 years old.

Two cows and calves one heifer three sheep two sows and pigs four small shoal hogs, one axe one old shovel plow - \$60.00.

I Jesse Gattlin am a farmer by occupation byt by sickness affecting my limbs am altogether unable to earn my own living.



(REVOLUTIONARY WAR DECLARATIONS)

Have in family Elizabeth Gattin (my wife) age sixty two years old also my daughter twenty two years old who is a cripple and unable to contribute either to her own or my support. Those two mentioned are all I have in family.

(Sworn to and declared on the 8th day of February 1821.)

I Jesse Harper, clerk of the Court of the Court of Pleas quarter session for the County of Randolph and State of North Carolina also hereby certify that the foregoing oath and the schedule thereto annexed one truly copose(?) from the records of said Court and I do further certify that it is the opinion of said Court that the total amount in value of the property exhibited in the aforesaid schedule is sixty dollars and no more.

In testimony where of I have hereon set my hand and affixed the Seal of Said Court on the eighth day of February Eighteen Hundred and Twenty One.

Jesse Gattin the dedasamt having made a declaration under the act of Congress of 18th March 1818 a pension certificate no 4695 ussyed to him from the Department of War (?) starts (?) states 1st December 1818 under which he alliaiges he drew his penson of eight dollars per month until the act of 1820 took effect - the penson Certificate aforesaid was produced by him to this court at the time he made one foregoing declaration.

On the 12th day of February eighteen hundred and twenty five personally appeared in open court, being a court of record for the county and state aforesaid John Thompson ages ninety one or two years, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the Acts of Congress of the Eighteenth March Eighteen Hundred and Eighteen and the first of May eighteen hundred and twenty that the said John Thompson entered for the term of three years on the ----- Charles City in the state of Virginia in the Company commanded by Captain William Grgory in the Regement Commanded by Colonel Blount in the line for the state of Virginia on the Continental Establishment that he continue to serve in the same corps until the ----- of ----- . When he was discharged from the (?) Land of service in Williamsburgh in the state of Virginia. That he was in the Battle of Monmouth as a regular soldier and served with the army under Washington and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service except that is here in set forth.

And in pursuance of the act of the first of May eighteen hundred and twenty one I do solely swear that I was a citizen of the United States on the eighteenth of March eighteen hundred and eighteen and that I have not since that time by gift or sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part there of with the intent thereby so todiminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitles , " An Act of provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval serwives of the United

States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the eighteenth day of March eighteen hundred and eighteen and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property securities contracts or debts to me, not have I any income, not property of any kind whatsoever except my wearing clothes.

I John Thompson am a farmer by occupation but by old age and infirmity I am altogether unable to earn my own living.

Sworn to and declared on the 12th day February A. D. 1825

Ed. note:

1840 census lists Elizabeth Gattin receiving a pension, age 80 years old (The census taken 23 Nov. 1840) She was living in the southern part of Randolph County. This would make her born 1760.

Jesse Gattin stated in his declaration he was 72 years old in Feb. 18, 1821. He would have been born 1749 and was 31 or 32 years old when he served in the Revolutionary War.

John Thompson declared he was 91 or 92 years old 1825. He would have been born 1734 or 1735 and was 45 or 46 years old when he fought in the Revolutionary War.

There are 543 pages in this book, beginning Nov. 1820 with the Pleas and Quarter sessions held at the Courthouse, Asheboro, N. C., and the 1825 Nov. session ends page 523. Pages 524-541 are Feb. 1826 term and the last page does not say the Court adjourned so it is carried over in another book.

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#### HOPEWELL CHURCH STEEPED IN HISTORY

May 6, 1963, by Braxton Younts, Enterprise Staff Writer

Hopewell Methodist Church in Randolph County south of Trinity today celebrated its annual homecoming, as well as the conclusion of a revival series.

These meetings are different from those at the same site in the founding years of Hopewell.

Hopewell the church had its beginning as Hopewell the school.

Bob Royals of Trinity, a lifelong member of Hopewell Methodist Church, has done research into the history of the church and community. He said that the old school house at Hopewell was built about 1790.

Indications are, Royals continued, that the name Hopewell derives from Hopewell Township in Pennsylvania as well as the Hopewell Presbyterian Church on the banks of the Susquehanna River in Pennsylvania.

"The early history of this section of Pennsylvania contains the names of many families who are later listed in the 1790 census of Randolph and Guilford Counties, such as Elder, Gray, Means, Merrell, Lytle, Clark, Blair and Johnson. The Leaches came from Hopewell, N. J., which was nearby."

He gives an interesting sidelight into the affairs of the period.

"The minister who served as the second pastor of the churches of Derry and Paxton in Pennsylvania was Rev. John Elder, the famed "fighting parson", who served for more than 40 years. Among those who signed with Rev. Mr. Elder were John Gray, Alexander Johnson, William Elder, John Clark, James Graham, and Allen Blair. These people left Pennsylvania because of unrest, unfriendly Indians and troubled times. They began to arrive in North Carolina in the Hopewell Community around 1770 and continued this until after 1790."

Seven church buildings have served the Hopewell congregations. The first was the old schoolhouse which was built around 1790. The first church building was built later. It was of logs. It was torn down and rebuilt in 1822. This building was used until 1851, when again it was rebuilt.

The 1851 church was of frame construction and measured approximately 36 feet wide and 50 feet long. It was added to and remodeled in 1912-13.

In 1940 a new church edifice was completed and used for the first time on Easter Sunday, March 24. Snow was on the ground on that date, Royals recalls.

On Sunday, Jan. 13, 1941, as the congregation assembled for the 11 o'clock service this new church caught fire and burned to the ground.

From then until the present sanctuary was completed, and occupied on Dec. 19, 1948, the Hopewell congregation worshipped in the old T. J. Finch home at Wheatmore, nearby.

The present church was dedicated on Jan. 27, 1952. Its pastor is Rev. Bryce Smith, who resides in the parsonage adjacent to the gray stone building which is the modern-day Hopewell.

In looking back over the Hopewell history, Royals noted that a lot of the early settlers were Quakers and Scotch-Irish Presbyterians. Many of these early settlers turned Methodist, probably because of the circuit-riders of the day.

Many things have occurred in the quiet, small area which is Hopewell, since the days of the late 1700's when the settling began. However, today it remains much as it was in the past, a church in a beautiful area of farming and dairying, quiet and sedate in the Randolph hills.

Mr. Johnson is survived by two sons, Orastus Johnson and William Johnson, of Sophia. The funeral services was conducted in the Old Union Church, February 27th. Rev. J. A. Bowles the pastor conducting the service. Favorite hymns, "Nearer My God to Thee" and "How Firm a Foundation" were sung, after which the body was laid to rest in the cemetery.

Mr. J. W. Tippet, Aged Citizen, Dead

Mr. J. W. Tippet, out oldest citizen died at him home February 19th. He was a son of Luke Tippet and was born in Davidson County, April 23, 1836, being in his 86th year at the time of his death. Deceased moved to this county while a young man and settled at Cedar Falls and was married the first time June 24, 1856, to Miss Katherine Sinclair, of Cedar Falls. To this union were born eight children, all survive but one, Mrs. Etta Cox. Those who survive him are Wm. H. Tippet, John M. Tippet, and Mrs. W. D. Maner, of Franklinville; George H. Tippet, of South Carolina, Martin Luther Tippet of South Carolina; Robert L. Tippet and Mrs. Tom Martin of Virginia. He is also survived by 38 grandchildren and 42 great grandchildren. Deceased was married the second time to Miss Mollie Self, of Franklinville, September 20, 1891, who survives him. Mr. Tippet moved from Cedar Falls to Franklinville many years ago and lived there for perhaps fifty years or more and has many friends in this community. He was considered one of our most substantial citizens and was loved and respected by all who knew him. He professed religion in 1870 under the ministry of Rev. Hiram P. Cole.

THE FOUR ISAAC'S

The four Isaac's were probably Cousins: Singing Ike, Red Ike, Whistling Ike, and Sam's Ike.

Isaac Pennington Farlow, "Singing Ike," was the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Branson Farlow. He was born October 10, 1857. He and his brothers and sisters were educated in the country schools of that time and Isaac went to Guilford College. (Prior to 1889 Guilford College was called New Garden Academy.) He was a talented singer and musician. He taught singing schools throughout the South. He probably travelled mostly by horse and buggy and the melodian he used in his singing school was strapped on to the back of the buggy.

He was twice married. Jesse and Joseph were sons of his first marriage, both died young. His second wife was Minnie Crews, they had one child still- born.

In his later years he studied to be a Chiropractor and located in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He made his last trip back to the state and county of his birth in the 1920's. He visited with his nieces and nephews, children of his brother Jesse, for several weeks. In 1937 his niece, Mrs. Eugene Lassiter, her husband, and two of her children, Jessie and Charles "Bud" visited him and his wife. He died in Dec. 7, 1937. His wife visited here in the 1940's.

Isaac Farlow, "red Ike," so called because of his red beard was born August 24, 1854 and died November 21, 1924. He was married to Martha Davis.

Isaac Farlow, "Whistling Ike," got his nick-name from his ability to whistle.

Sam's Ike was the son of Samuel Farlow.

In the cemetery at Marlboro Friends Meeting, Randolph County, N. C., a historical monument was erected to the Farlow family on June 16, 1948. This monument was erected at the graves of Nathan and Ruth because they were the father and mother of all Farlows now living in North Carolina. While it may be of primary interest to the North Carolina tribe, it should be of interest to all American Farlows. On this monument will be found the names of the eleven children of Nathan and Ruth, their sixty-eight grandchildren, their husbands and wives, arranged in family groups. The ancestors of Nathan for five generations and those of Ruth for four generations are arranged in the same manner. A careful study of the monument will enable any Farlow who knows his immediate ancestors to trace his ancestors back ten to thirteen generations. It is hoped that future generations will make use of the monument for their pleasure and profit, if they are interested in family history.

The monument was dedicated on the sixteenth of June, 1948, witnessed by a large company of Farlows, relatives, and friends. The cost of this beautiful piece of work was eight hundred seventy-five dollars. A list of contributors to this fund is given below.

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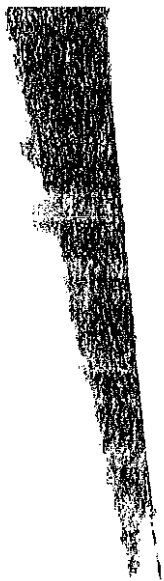
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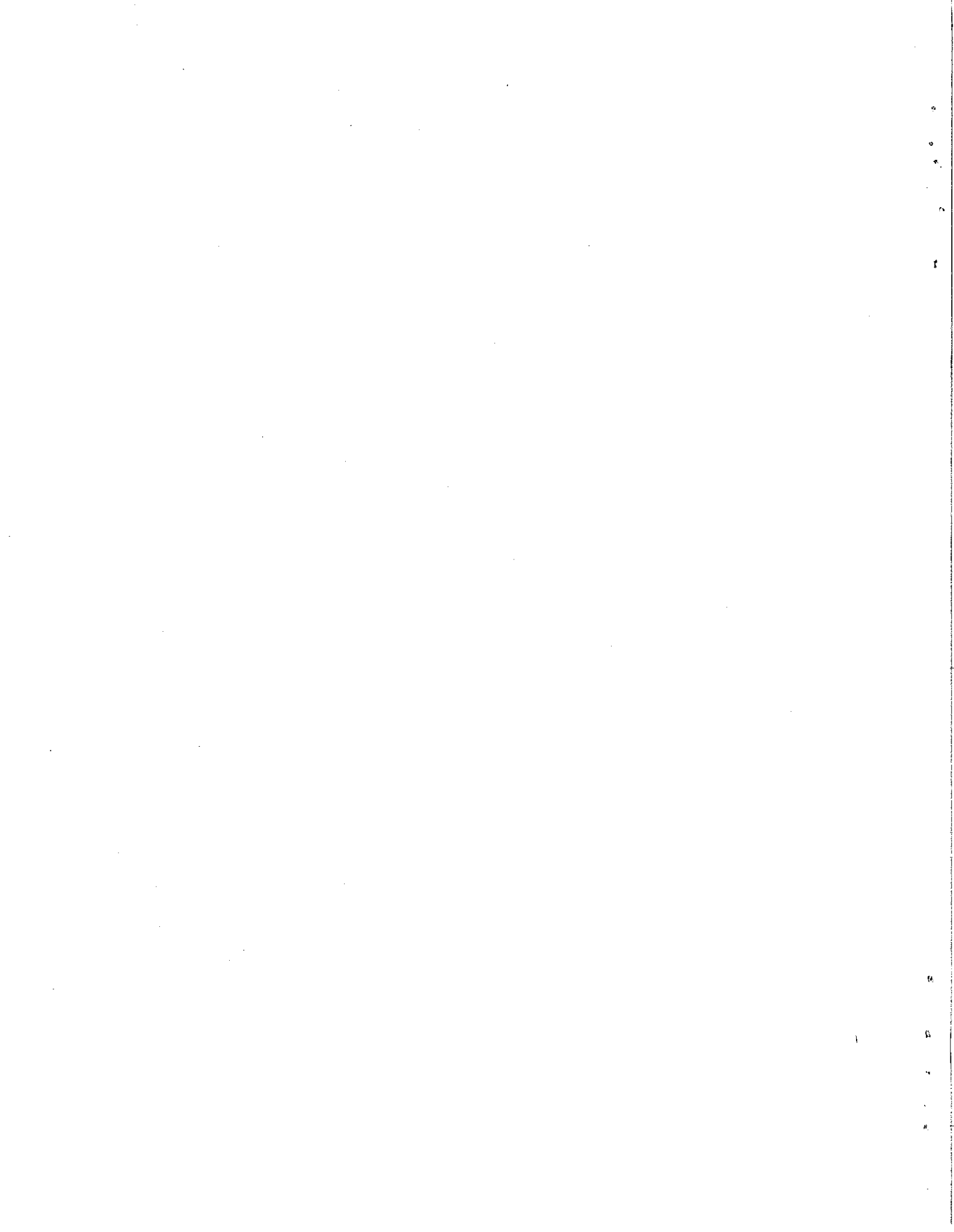

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HALL FAMILY NAME

The Hall name has been prominent throughout recorded history from the very beginning of the adoption of surnames. It derives from the Anglo-Saxon "halle" meaning a superior dwelling or one more pretentious than the normal. Of 'local' derivation, the name was taken by people who lived near or at such a hall, or in fact worked there. A curious origin is attached to the coat of arms used by the first Halls who came to America. These arms were granted to a physician of the Court of England who prescribed the root of the columbine to be administered to a child of the Royal Family.

The grateful King knighted this physician and his shield was charged with three columbines. However, more than ninety grants of arms have been made to the Hall name, some of them dating back to the beginning of Heraldry. The name first appeared on record in Essex in the year 1178, and in Hampshire in 1199.

It also appeared in Scotland in the year 1200, and in the year 1370 a Hall was awarded a grant of land on Renfrewshire, Scotland, for "his faithful service".

The English Bishop and satirist, Joseph Hall, who was born in the year 1574, had his satires burnt by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Other men whose works were burnt by this man were John Marston, Marlowe and Sir John Davies. However, it is believed that Hall's works were unjustly condemned and they were later ordered to be "staid at the press" which may be interpreted as reprieved.

Basil Hall was a British Naval officer, traveller and writer who was born at Edinburgh in 1788. His father was Sir James Hall of Dungleass, Scotland. In 1816 Basil Hall commanded the sloop 'Lyra' which accompanied Lord Amherst's embassy to China. Charles Francis Hall was an American Arctic explorer who volunteered to 'go in search for the bones of Franklin. He did find however, the relics of Frobisher's 16th century voyages.

So many of the Halls mademarks in History it is difficult to list them all, but coming up to Charles Martin Hall who was born in 1863 in America we find that he was the founder of the Aluminum Company of America. He discovered Electrolytic processes that made large-scale aluminum possible.

#### THOMPSON FAMILY NAMES

The Thompson name is one of patronymic origin from "Son of Thom" which was a nickname for the popular baptismal name "Thomas". There are several other spellings which include Thomson, Tompson, Tomsen and Tomson. In Scotland "Thomson" is more generally used but in England and Ireland the name is seldom found without the "p".

Surnames took root in the 12th century and were instigated by large land owners, nobility and ruling lords and barons. When the father died the son inherited the land and naturally assumed the same name, title, and identification. The servants, retainers, vassals and people of the villages soon followed suit. They had no large estates and were distinguished by their occupation, by a nickname, by a particular place of residence or by their father's personal name. Thus we have Thompson, Johnson, Williamson and Robertson.

Records show the development of the Thompson name and its use as a surname as early as the 12th century in England. A John Thompson is recorded in Whitby England, as having paid taxes on land holdings in the year 1394.

In a Scottish register as about the same year a John "Thomesson" is listed which shows the independent development of the name in Scotland.

Thompsons have distinguished themselves throughout the British Empire and America. Two were created barons (Baron Wenlock and Baron Haversham), another was the Lord Mayor of London in the year 1737 and many large estates and famous mansions were owned by them.

In America the early arrival of Thompsons in the year 1634 to Long Island from Lancaster was soon followed by many accomplishments in civic, military, and political fields.

These are more than 20 recorded armorial grants to the Thompson name in the British Isles. One of the more ancient is described "per pale argent and or an eagle displayed gules." Translated this shows the background divided vertically with the left side colored silver and the right gold. Over all this is an eagle with its wings expanded and colored red. Symbolically the eagle represents courage and fortitude and when it is combined with the color red it adds a connotation of perseverance and daring.

#### Floyd Family Name

Floyd (Mrs. B. F. S.) is a Welsh name, meaning "gray." It expressed the Englishman's attempt at pronouncing the Welsh name LLOYD. This name has come over into English as both Floyd and Flood. The earliest reference I can find to the name Floyd is in Bardsley's "Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames." Bardsley mentions "Thomas Lloyd or Floyd" under date of May 31, 1510. Floyd is listed three times in "Burke's General Armory."

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
