

THE LASSITERS OF RANDOLPH

- Compiled by Ruby Lassiter Culver -

My purpose in this genealogy is trying to trace my family line beginning with my great great grandfather Micajah Lassiter. I regret that it is not a complete record. Some of the present generation of Lassiters failed to answer my letters about themselves and their families.

My uncle Tom Lassiter said he remembered his father and mother speaking of "Great Grand Sire Micajah." He was believed to be one of four brothers who came to this country from England. Two of the brothers settled in Wake County. Micajah and another brother settled in Randolph County.

Mrs. Bertha Ingram Fitzgerald of Asheboro, N. C., also a descendant of Micajah Lassiter supplied me with much of the information on Micajah's children and their descendants of his first marriage to Celia Spivey. I copied it as she had it in her records. I am a descendant of Micajah through his son Jesse, who was the father of Benjamin Hill Lassiter who was my grandfather. I have a vague memory of him; he died in 1921 when I was a small girl. Older ones of the family have always spoken of him as a man of great dignity and refinement.

My cousins have been most helpful in supplying me with information concerning their families, so our very own family line is about as complete as it can be made.

We of the Benjamin Hill Iassiter family have always been a close, loving family and while time and space have separated many of us, we still have the love and concern for each other that has always been a part of our lives.

The family name of Lassiter, being of English origin, is a variant spelling of Leicester and Lester. Leicester means "the walled town or camp on the river Legrs." The earliest records of the name Leicester (Lassiter or Lester) concerns Hugo de Legrecestra, whose name appears in the Leicester Pipe Rolls for the year 1130. The name Lecester and Lester appear once each in "Burke's General Armory."

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF EZEKIAL LASSITER

I Ezekial Lassiter bring in feeble health, but of sound mind, do make and declare the following as my last will and testament.

I give to my wife Margaret Lassiter, during her natural life, my home plantation and all adjoining lands, containing in all about seven hundred and sixty nine acres, All the household and kitchen furniture, All the bacon, lard, and all pertains to the meat house. All the corn, wheat, oats, fodder, hay, straw and all the articles pertaining to the barn which may be on hand at my death. One wagon, all the farming tools, one carriage and a buggy and the harness. All my horses, cattle and hogs and three thousand dollars in cash.

I direct my executors to expend one hundred dollars each in the burial of my self and my wife, and in the erection at the head and feet of each of our graves suitable tomb-stones with proper inscriptions.

I direct my executors to sell the residue of my property and collect all the debts due me and after paying all my just debts, funeral expenses included and the expenses of executing this will, and three thousand dollars to my wife - that they devide the same into six equal parts and pay one sixth to the children of my brother Hill deceased 1862.

One sixth to the children of my sister Bethany, deceased, One sixth to the children of my brother Jacob, deceased. One sixth to my brother William. and the remaining sixth to my brother, John. After the death of my wife I direct all the property herein before given to her during her natural life, to be sold and the net proceeds and all monies on hand if any be, to be devided into six equal parts and one part or sixth to be paid to the children of my sister Bethany, deceased. One sixth to be paid to the children of my brother Jacob, deceased, One sixth to my brother William and the remaining sixth to be paid my brother John. And should either of said brothers, William and John die before the payment of said legacies then it is my will that the children of such deceased brothers shall have the legacy which their deceased father would have received if alive.

Further I give all the money that may be die me or my estate by the will of my brother Josiah Lassiter, deceased after the death of his wife, or his widow to be devided into six equal parts. One sixth to be paid to the children of my brother Hill Lassiter, deceased, one sixth to be paid to the children of my sister Bethany, deceased. One sixth to be paid to the children of my brother Jesse, deceased. One sixth to be paid to the children of my brother Jacob, deceased, One sixth to brother William , and the remaining sixth to my brother John and should wither of said brothers William and John die before the payment of said legacy, then it is my will that the children of said deceased brothers shall have the legacy which their deceased father would have received if alive.

I appoint Jonathan Lassiter and John Lassiter executors of this my last will and testament.

Benjamin Hill Lassiter

Benjamin Hill (Bennie) Lassiter was born Jan 7, 1838 in lower Randolph County at Lassiter's Mill. He was educated in the schools of that area and as a young man taught school before volunteering for service in the Confederate States Army. On June 18, 1861 at the age of 23 he enlisted and was mustered into service at Camp Mangum Raleigh. He was in Co. L. 22nd Inf. Reg. His records show that he was in 13 major battles including Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg along with his two brothers Thomas and Henry. He was captured at Hatcher's Run, Va. on April 20, 1865 and was a prisoner of war on Hart's Island in New York Harbor until his release June 19, 1865. His name is carried on the Confederate Roll of Honor.

On December 19, 1867 he was married to Margaret Sirona Nance, daughter of William and Lavine Steed Nance. Nine children were born of this marriage. Seven were born at Lassiter's Mill. In 1883 he moved his family to Randleman. Eugene was the youngest in the family then, Rossa and Thomas were born in Randleman.

The Lassiter family first lived in the home now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Dennis Moser. They later bought the home on Main Street now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Gray Lamb and lived there for some years.

Upon coming to Randleman Benjamin was employed in the engine room of the Randleman Manufacturing Company. The mill was operated by steam then and his job was running the engines. Also working in the mill was his five oldest children; William, Rose, Claudia, and Ella were weavers and John (Bud) twisted in the beaming room. When he left the mill his job was taken over by Hilliard Hill, another Confederate veteran.

In 1892 he opened a store on Plaidville Branch near the old Town Hall. Adjoining it was a tin shop run by Duncan Newlin and a barber shop run by John Wood. Across the street was the company store run by N. N. and John Newlin, Clark Hinshaw and Bennie Milliken.

He was a member and took an active part in St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church South. He was a member of the Randleman School Board in 1902-03 along with S. Bryant and F. Ingold. The principal of the school was William V. McRace. He was also a member of the New Salom Lodge number 209. The Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of N. C. serving as treasurer in 1899-1900.

In 1906 he bought 150 acres of land that was a part of the three or four hundred acres owned by J. F. Davidson on High Point St. He and his sons soon had much of this land under cultivation. In the space which consisted of about four acres back of the house and farm buildings he planted a large apple orahard which produced apples from May to late fall. It was considered one of the finest orahards of the area. In it he had Magnum Bonum, Banana, Grimes Golden, Horse, Sheepnose, June, Harvest, Winesaps, and many other varieties. Helslso grew other kinds of fruit. Several varieties of plums, pears and there was two enormous ox-hart cherry trees near the house.

There was two small gold mines on this property, one near where the Randleman High School is now located and the other about a mile west, but they were never very productive.

As long as he was able he attended the reunions or encampments of the old Confederate Soldiers. Travelling by train to Charlotte, Greensboro, Richmond, New Orleans, and Gettysburg where ever they were held. Many other old soldiers accompanied him on these trips - Hilliard Hill, Samuel Aldridge, James Howell, James York, and Morris Hughes.

About two years ago among some old papers was found the copy of his Oath of Allegiance to the United States. It reads:

I, B. H. Lassiter of Randolph County, State of North Carolina do solemnly swear of affirm in presence of Almighty God, that I will henceforth faithfully support, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Union of the States thereunder, and I will, in loke manned, abide by and faithfully support all laws and proclamations which have been made during the existing rebellion with reference to the *mancipation of slaves. So help me God.

Sworn and subscribed to the 6th day of September A. D. 1865 before Z. Rush.

MARGARET SIRONA NANCE LASSITER

Margaret Nance was born July 4, 1848 in lower Randloph County near Lassiter's Mill. Her parents were William and Lavinia (Viny) Steed Nance. Her people as was Benjamin's were one of the pioneer families in Randolph County. Her grandparents were Marshall and Elizabeth Ivey Nance. Her great grandfather was William Nance.

She was educated in the schools of that time and was skilled in all the homemeking arts - knitting, weaving, spinning, sewing, the making of candles, scap, and all the things that tend to make a good home maker.

After moving to Randleman and to their home on High Point Street, it became the custom starting about 1905 to celebrate her birthday on July 4 with a family reunion and birthday dinner. This continued most every year until 1936. The last reunion occurred in 1937 shortly before her 89 birthday when a niece Mamie Henry from California, daughter of her brother Thomas Nance visited her. Her brothers were Cyrus who never returned from the Civil War and Thomas who went west after the War. Her sisters were Queen Elizabeth who married Henry Brookshire, Downam, who married Alson Hughes, Nancy Jane who married John Bescher and Laura never married.

She often talked of how times were during the War Between the States and of Reconstruction days in the South. Her memories of Lassiters Mill and the people of that area were vivid and that part of the county today in much like it was as she remembered it.

Of their children Thomas the youngest son is living on High Point Street, Randleman. He will be 86 this August.

The old Lassiter home was town down several years ago to make way for the Randleman High School. But we Lassiter cousins could never forget our growing up years and our beloved grandma Lassiter and when we gathered to celebrate her birthday under the shade of mimosa and oak.

Alva Eugene Lassiter was born Dec. 13, 1880 at Lassiter's Mill, N. C. in lower Randolph County. He was the seventh child of Benjamin Hill and Margaret Nance Lassiter.

In 1883 his father moved his family to Randleman. During his young years he attended Bloomfield School until he was about eighteen. In those days school terms lasted from four to six months. Most summers his father sent him, and usually one of his younger brothers, to subscription schools which were popular at that time. Evie Cox and Alpheus Mendenhall were two of his teachers.

In 1902 he went to work as a fireman on the Southern Railway. In the summer of 1903 he fired two trips on Old 97. This was the train that wrecked on Sept. 27, 1903 in Danville, Va. This wreck inspired the ballad, "Wreck of the Old 97," which is popular today.

On June 10, 1907 he was married to Miss Mary Alice Elizabeth Farlow (1882 - 1950), daughter of Jesse Elwood and Sarah Davidson Farlow.

He was a member of the First United Methodist Church and took an active part until his health failed. At one time, he had ten years or more perfect attendance.

During his long life, he enjoyed many hobbies such as fishing, being a charter member of the Spencer, N. C. Fishing Club, bee-keeping, farming, and traveling. He also had a love for poetry which he taught his children.

In June 1940 he was promoted to engineer for the Southern Railway. In Feb. 1949, he retired at the age of 69.

He was a charter member of the North Randolph Historical Society and while not able to take an active part, he was a strong supporter in the Society and the restoration of St. Paul Methodist Episcopal Church South into a museum.

He died at his home on July 1, 1970 and is buried in St. Paul Cemetery.

Thomas Henderson Lassiter

He was born in lower Randolph County near Lassiter's Mill on Uwharrie River in 1841. At the age of 20 on November 4, 1861 he volunteered for service in the Confederate States Army and was among the first to go from Randolph County. He was mustered into service at Camp Mangum, Raleigh, N. C. with Capt Noah Rush's company known as "The Uwharrie Boys" which eventually became Company H of the 38th Infantry N. C. State Troops. He was in the battles of Mechanicsville, Gaines Mill, Malvern Hill, Cedar Mountain, Second Manassas, Ox Hill, Harper's Ferry, Antietam. and Fredericksburg.

He was transferred to Company L 22nd N. C. Inf. on March 7, 1863 in which two brothers Benjamin and Henry were also serving. He was wounded three times first in the fighting around Richmond before his transfer. The second wound was at Chancellorsville and later wounded for the third time at Reams Station. His records show he had a forefinger on his left hand amputated and also suffered a hip would. His daughter Chloe said that he also carried a Yankee bullet in his right leg to his grave.

His records show that he was captured at Hatcher's Run, Va. on April 2, 1865 and imprisoned on Hart's Island in New York Harbor. He was released in June 19, 1865. His name is carried on the Confederate Roll of Honor.

He has one daughter Martha Lee Green Bolin living now (1973) and a number of grandchildren and great grandchildren living in the Charlotte and Hildebran N. C. Area.

Henry C. Lassiter was born in lower Randolph County at Lassiter's Mill. At the age of 21 he volunteered for service in the Confederate States army on June 18, 1861 and was mustered into service at Camp Mangum in Raleigh, N. C. into Company L 22nd North Carolina Infantry Regiment. The 22nd North Carolina Infantry served in the Army of Northern Virginia in every battle of consequence except First Manassas or Bull Run.

He was in Pickett's charge at Gettysburg and one of 12 survivors of Company L who reached Virginia on the retreat out of the original company of 178 men. His two brothers Benjamin and Thomas were also among the 12 who survived.
